Greetings from Jeevana School!

As we come to the close of the current academic year and prepare to welcome a new one, we would like to share the following important updates and information with you.

1. Annual reports for all classes from KG to Std VIII will be sent through 'Chennaicampus'. Reports for the KG section will be uploaded on 31st March, 2026. Reports for Std I to Std VIII will be uploaded on or before 23rd April, 2026. Fee details for all classes will be sent on the same day as the reports.
2. Written requests for Transfer Certificates, if required, should be submitted **by 6th March, 2026**. Failure to do so will result in the first-term fees for the next academic year becoming payable.

4. **COMMUNICATION SOFTWARE:**

The School will continue with Chennai Campus, <https://erp.chennaicampus.com/jeevana> for communicating important information to parents. This site has details of Time Table, Assignments / Homework, Notice Board, Student Details, Marks / Reports, Announcements, etc. Important communication will also be sent as notification through this portal. Parents are requested to check this on a periodic basis.

5. **DIARY**

Students of Std I to Std X will be provided with a hardcopy of school diary to record their daily homework and important notes. Parents are requested to check and sign the diary every day to ensure regular follow-up and communication between home and school.

6. **WEBSITE**

All major school activities are updated on the school website every week or two. Parents are encouraged to stay informed by regularly visiting the website: www.jeevanaschool.com

7. **EMAIL ID FOR COMMUNICATION**

Please note that all official communication from the school will be sent to your child's designated ".in" email ID created by the school. We kindly request you to check this email daily to stay updated on important information. Please do not share the password with your children as the mails are meant only for parents.

8. **IMPORTANCE OF ENGLISH:**

To help your child excel in CIE and ICSE, we encourage you to support their English language development. Reading English storybooks and watching high-quality programs on TV or YouTube can be beneficial. Discussing these experiences and writing about them further reinforce learning. Consistent practice is essential for improving proficiency. Additionally, we urge you to foster a love for reading by encouraging them to use our library and, if possible, providing them with good books at home.

9. **SECOND LANGUAGE :**

As per the Tamil Nadu Government's directive, all students up to Std X will study Tamil as their Second Language. Additionally, students from Std III to Std VIII will study Hindi as their Third Language.

10. **MENTAL ABILITY**

The school will continue conducting Mental Ability classes for students of Std VI to Std VIII. These sessions will help students develop critical thinking skills and prepare them for various entrance examinations in the future.

11. **MINDSPARK**

Students in Std IV to Std VI will engage in the Mindspark program for English, while those in Std VII and Std VIII will focus on Mathematics. This computer-based program is designed to enhance subject skills, with two school periods dedicated to it. Additionally, students are expected to complete assignments at home. Please note, students can spend 30 – 40 minutes on Mindspark every day.

12. **YI**

Jeevana School is proud to be an active participant in **YI**, an outreach initiative of Young Indians (Yi), the youth wing of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII). Yi is a nationwide movement committed to Nation Building, Youth Leadership, and Social Responsibility, with a strong presence through chapters across India, including Yi Madurai. Through **YI Thalir**, our primary students are introduced to value-based education, leadership development, civic awareness, and essential life skills at an early age. The programme nurtures responsible citizenship, confidence, collaboration, and a sense of purpose, shaping our students into thoughtful leaders of tomorrow.

13. **SOF Olympiad Exams**

The Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF) is a premier international organization that promotes academic excellence and competitive learning across various subjects. Students of Std. V to Std. VIII from our school participate in the SOF Olympiad examinations in English, Mathematics, and Science, reflecting our commitment to nurturing analytical skills, academic achievement, and a spirit of healthy competition.

14. **CAREER GUIDANCE:**

Students of Std IX to Std XII will receive Career Guidance as part of a comprehensive developmental program. This initiative helps students make informed educational and occupational choices, equipping them to make mature and well-informed decisions about their future. These sessions are handled by Mr Shyam Krishnamurthy, who is a corporate professional with around 30 years of experience primarily in technology based product firms, especially start-ups. In 2017, he founded "the Interview Portal" (<https://theinterviewportal.com>), an exclusive collection of career stories of professionals who thought and acted differently, pursuing the careers they loved. With this initiative, he hopes to make a difference by helping the next generation make their own career choices guided by their aspirations instead of peer pressure, parental pressure and societal pressure.

15. **VALUE EDUCATION:**

Value education is essential for school children as it helps them develop strong moral character, empathy and a sense of responsibility. It teaches important values such as honesty, kindness, respect and teamwork, which shape their behaviour and decision-making. By learning these values early, children grow into compassionate and responsible citizens who contribute positively to society. Students from Std I to Std VIII attend weekly Value Education classes, where essential life values are discussed. Parents are encouraged to reinforce these values at home.

Prepmyskills is a unique programme offered to Std VII students as a part of Value Education. It's objective is to facilitate Holistic Development with a focus on Social, Emotional, Physical, Mental, and Intellectual well-being. The program endeavours to empower every child by providing inputs that go beyond academics.

16. **SOFT SKILLS:**

Soft skills are essential for students as they help in effective communication, teamwork, and problem-solving. Skills like leadership, adaptability, empathy, and time management prepare them for academic and personal success. Developing these skills in school enhances confidence, builds strong relationships, and equips students for future challenges in both education and career. The school conducts sessions for students of all classes to imbibe the above.

17. **OPEN DOOR ASSESSMENTS:**

Students benefit from personalized online tutoring and learning experiences, ensuring a more tailored approach to education. These are thinking assessments that ensure mastery of the concepts in Maths and Science. This program is offered to Std IV, Std V & Std VII.

18. **FIELD TRIPS:**

Our school organizes enriching field trips that provide students with hands-on learning experiences beyond the classroom. Children will be taken to places like Thenparankundram, agricultural farms, Nilayur, Alagar Kovil, Coos and Paws, Keezhadi, Arittapatti, CECRI, Karaikudi and Science Park, Thirumayam, Anas Farms, Joyful Jumps etc.

19. **NO-BAG DAY:**

Students of Std VI – Std VIII will have 10 No-Bag days to create a stress-free, engaging and practical environment. They will have hands-on activities, interactive sessions, movie time and life skills sessions.

20. **TALENT TIME:**

The school will continue the weekly Intraschool Talent Time programme for students from KG to Std XII. Please note that for students of KG to Std II, the focus will be on participation and confidence building. No prizes will be awarded for these classes, as the objective is to encourage self-expression, stage confidence, and joyful involvement rather than competition. Students from Std III to Std XII will be engaged in these competitions in an amateur profile, thereby prizes will be awarded based on their performance. Parents may refer to the competition schedule in the Digital Diary on the school website.

21. **SUPW:**

Socially useful and productive work has been recognized as very important in the education of children. The present education scenario is bookish in character and far away from the needs of the society. SUPW also leads to personality development and social transformation.

SUPW develops healthy habits of work by developing a positive attitude towards work. The child slowly develops the habit of co-operating with others and does any work willingly and confidently. Not only this, he/she exhibits responsible behaviour in all situations in life. With all this in mind the school has SUPW and community service as a regular part in the curriculum.

22. TESTS, ASSESSMENTS & EXAMINATIONS:

Std I to Std VIII follow the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) system to assess both academic and non-academic performance. Std I to Std V include assessments in academics, Physical Education, and Co-curricular Activities. Std VI to Std VIII extend the evaluation to include Clubs, Karate and Yoga. Life Skills Assessments focus on key competencies such as communication, teamwork, and problem-solving. This holistic approach ensures the well-rounded development of every student.

23. ATTITUDES AND VALUE SYSTEM:

The school emphasizes the development of strong values and positive attitudes among students. Key focus areas include: Spirituality, Punctuality, Leadership, Cleanliness, Humility, Courtesy and Sociability. For further details, please refer to the Digital Diary on the school website.

24. MENTORING & COUNSELING:

Teachers provide one-to-one mentoring for selected students, ensuring each child has a trusted confidante to help them face challenges and work through solutions. For students in Std IX to Std XII—where academic pressure is higher—mentoring is conducted in smaller groups. Additionally, our School Counsellors Ms Mary Magdalene and Ms Subha G are available to support any student in need, and the Principal will conduct “Happy Parenting” sessions with parents.

25. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES & CLUBS:

Our co-curricular program offers activities such as Dance, Chess, Music, Violin, Mridangam, Guitar, Environment club, GK club, creative writing and Art. Students in Std VI to Std VIII can choose between co-curricular and academic activities, while those in Std III to Std V focus exclusively on co-curricular options. Parents will receive a Google Form to select four preferred activities for their child, from which the school will assign one. Meanwhile, students in Std I and Std II enjoy an Activity Period featuring Singing, Craft, Art, and Storytelling. Selected students are given training in debate, creative writing and GK after school hours. Please note students are advised to continue in the same club activity for at least two years.

26. PREFECTORIAL SYSTEM:

The Prefectorial system helps the students to develop a sense of responsibility towards their juniors. It also helps them to develop leadership qualities. Students who can set an example for others in discipline, academics, sports & extra-curricular activities are selected as Prefects. They have a committee of students who help in improving various aspects of the school. All the Prefects are from the senior – most class and are true to the adage – Example is better than precept.

27. COMMITTEES:

The school encourages student leadership and responsibility through the following committees:

- Science Committee-* Students conduct Science Quiz and conduct science presentations.
- Make A Difference Committee-* Students are engaged in visiting old age homes/Orphanage and help the elderly people in the form of donations collected from School.
- Sports Committee-* Students conduct Sports events and Intramural matches in School for the Junior classes.
- Graffiti Committee-* Students monitor the overall cleanliness of the campus and ambience of classrooms and furniture.
- EVA Committee-* Students are engaged in maintaining a good Environment in and around the School.
- Cultural Committee-* Students are engaged in organising Annual days and other events in the School. For term-wise participation, **Std XII students** will take responsibility in the **1st term**, and **Std XI students** will take over in the **2nd term**.

28. KARATE & YOGA:

These activities are compulsory for all students in Std VI to Std VIII.

29. AEROBICS:

All students in the Junior Section will participate in Aerobics / Dance once a week.

30. GAMES:

Our sports program includes Cricket, Football, Pickle ball, Basketball, Throw ball, Badminton, Kho-Kho, and Table Tennis, with games organized three to four days per week. For interested students, after-school training sessions in Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, and Tennis are available at an extra cost.

31. TRANSPORT:

Transport will be organized on school-designated routes, subject to seat availability.

This service is not available for PreKG. Details will be shared before the end of April 2026.

32. TUCK SHOP:

The Tuck Shop offers a selection of healthy snacks, including branded biscuits, Moong Dal, Peanut Candy, and Tata Gluco+, all with less sugar.

33. CCTV:

For enhanced safety, CCTV cameras have been installed in all classrooms and at strategic points throughout the campus.

34. MEETINGS WITH HEADS & TEACHERS:

During the 2026-2027 academic year, parents are welcome to meet the HM/Vice Principal/Principal on any working day between 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., by prior appointment only. Class-wise meetings will be organized once a year. Should parents wish to meet teachers or school administrators outside of these times, appointments must be scheduled via email. Kindly refrain from calling, as it disrupts the school routine.

The height of the pinafore should be 2 cm below the knees. The pinafore must be worn with shorts or tights underneath.
Std I & Std II Boys:	Navy Blue full pants with pleats and striped shirt with half sleeves with a loop on the left shoulder to fix the ID Card.
Std III & Std IV Girls:	Striped Kameez with half sleeves with navy blue collar and a loop on the left shoulder to fix the ID Card.
Std III & Std IV Boys:	Navy Blue full pants with pleats and striped shirt with half-sleeves with a loop on the left shoulder to fix the ID Card.
Std V & above Girls:	Navy blue Salwar, Striped Kameez with half sleeves with navy blue collar and navy blue sleeveless overcoat. The width of the overcoat around shoulders should be the same as that of the Kameez.
Boys:	Navy blue full pants with pleats and striped shirt with half sleeves.

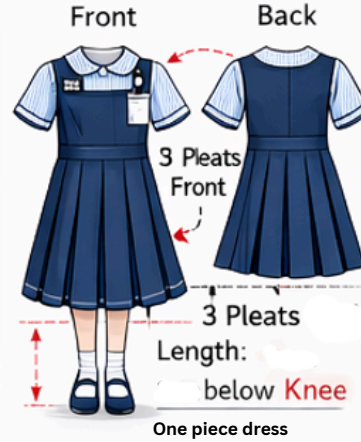

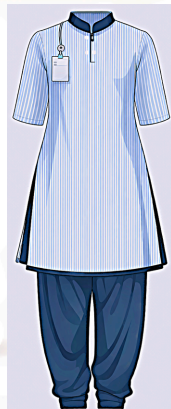

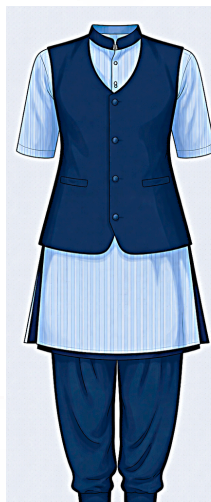
